Dates/Times: Plant Registration will take place on:

Friday, September 12th from 4:00 pm – 8:00 pm  
Saturday, September 13th from 8:00 am – 9:00 am

If you have many plants to enter, PLEASE email me your plant list as early as possible. I will accept pre-registration lists until Wednesday, Sept. 10th at 11:00 p.m. Send your email to Jay Klock [jklock@pacbell.net](mailto:jklock@pacbell.net). In the email, include the information listed on the plant registration form. Otherwise, please make sure to bring in a complete list of plant names for quick reference during the registration times listed above.

Exhibitors: Both members and non-members of the Orchid Forum of Sacramento may enter plants for ribbon judging; however, only members in good standing of the Orchid Forum of Sacramento are eligible for Best of Class/Best of Show awards.

Plant Registration Entrant Categories: There are two categories for people entering plants for ribbon judging, as follows:

- A novice is a non-professional grower who has not yet won five (5) 1<sup>st</sup> place ribbons, or an AOS/ODC trophy, or a Best of Class/Show Award at any AOS-judged orchid show.
- A hobbyist is a non-professional grower who has won five (5) or more 1<sup>st</sup> place ribbons, or an AOS/ODC award, or a Best of Class/Show award.

In addition, there is a category for best commercial plant judging, as follows:

- A commercial grower is a professional or business entrant who sells to the general public from an established place of business and whose primary source of income stems from the sale of plants and supplies.

NOTES:

- Each person entering plants into the show for ribbon judging is classified into only one of these three categories.
- Only novices and hobbyists need to submit plant registration forms for their entries.

Awards:

- At the discretion of the ribbon judges, qualifying novice and hobbyist plants in each class may be awarded 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbons.
- For 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place ribbons, novices only compete against other novices, and hobbyists with other hobbyists.

- Best of Class and Best of Show awards are drawn from all plants entered by Sacramento Orchid Forum members who are novices and hobbyists receiving a first place ribbon in the appropriate class. All of those who ribbon judge for a plant alliance will vote on the Best of Class plant for that alliance. All of those who ribbon judge the show will vote for the Best of Show award. Commercial entries will not be considered for these awards.
- All judges present shall vote for the Best Commercial Plant award. Novice and hobbyist plants will not be considered for this award.

General Rules:

- Plants must be correctly identified. Those entering plants for ribbon judging are responsible for entering their plants in the correct class, including the complete correct names and any awards given. Plant name and class of entry must be submitted on the entry form provided (see attached). Assistance in identifying plants will be available at the plant registration area, but this does not negate the ultimate responsibility of the entrant to ensure that all information is correct.
- Plants may only be entered into one class, plus, if qualified, as a specimen plant.
- There is no limit to the number of plants in a garden that may be registered for ribbon judging. A separate entry form for each entrant must be completed for plants located in each garden.
- Judges retain the option of not judging a plant that is entered in an inappropriate class.
- All plants entered for ribbon judging must remain on display throughout the entire show, unless arrangements have been made in advance due to extenuating circumstances.

AOS Judging:

- Any plant, including those in gardens, may be entered for AOS judging. If a plant is not to be considered for AOS judging, it is the responsibility of the entrant to indicate this on registration sheet in the blank provided.
- The owner of any plant receiving an AOS award (e.g., CCM, FCC, AM, HCC, etc.) is responsible for payment of any certificate and registration fees required by the AOS and charges for personal slides obtained from the AOS photographer.
- Plants earning an AOS award must remain on display throughout the entire show. Owners may claim their plants at the close of the show.
